



TRAFALGAR SQUARE TO WELCOME A SPECIAL "HELLO INDONESIA" EVENT SUPPORTED BY THE MAYOR OF LONDON

Exhibitors include the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy for Indonesia, and the Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in London, as well as the country's national carrier Garuda Indonesia, among others.
