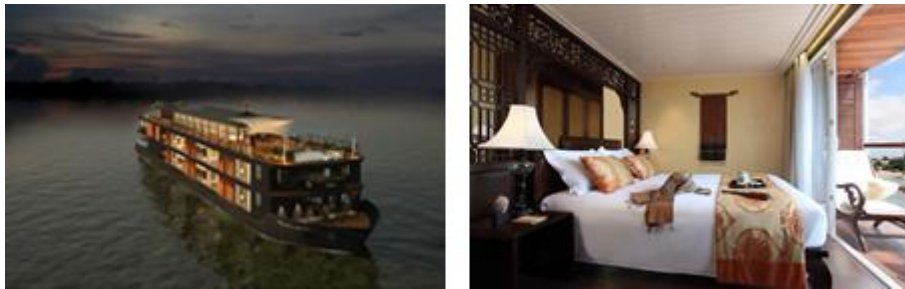




SET SAIL ON TRAVEL INDOCHINA'S NEW LUXURY ASIA RIVER CRUISES!

The specialist operator has also introduced two brand new river boats in Burma. The [Irrawaddy Explorer](#) will be the most luxurious ship to sail the Irrawaddy River once it takes its maiden voyage in September 2014, with Travel Indochina chartering specific departures. Meanwhile the [Sanctuary Ananda](#), a deluxe all-suite cruiser, will take its first sailing in November 2014. Both vessels will offer an intimate cruising experience with just 28 and 21 cabins respectively, and 12-day itineraries that lead passengers on enchanting journeys between the untouched regions of Mandalay and Yangon.
