Whether you want to take sailing lessons, wake up the James Bond in you on a speed boat or embark on a dolphin spotting safari, the Tagus River offers visitors the opportunity to experience a different side of Lisbon and its surroundings.

### From land into the water: Tour the river on a hippo!

Amphibious tours always promise a different and fun experience for visitors, especially when stepping from land into the water – on the same vehicle. The 90-minute tours plunge into the Tagus River for visitors to see monuments such as the Belém Tower (UNESCO World Heritage Site) and the Padrão dos Descobrimentos, amongst many others, from the 'other side'. www.hippotrip.com

### For wildlife spotting: Dolphin watching safaris

A colony of bottlenose dolphins made the Sado Estuary Nature Reserve their permanent home a few years ago. Here visitors can spot up to 30 dolphins, which live in the warm waters of the estuary and its adjacent coastline, the coast of Tróia and Arrábida. Dolphin watching tours depart daily from these two locations, which are easily linked to the Portuguese capital via public transport.
