São Silvestre de Lisboa Race

26th December 2015

São Silvestre de Lisboa is the city's most popular race, which will see around 12,000 runners saying goodbye to 2015 by competing in a 10k race across Lisbon. Starting and ending in famous Avenida da Liberdade, the race aims to promote the benefits of doing sports. Everybody is welcome to join, with different races for children also available.

New Year's Eve Party 31st December 2015

The most entertaining option to welcome the New Year in Lisbon: on the evening of 31st December, Praça do Comércio hosts street entertainment, music performances and a colourful fireworks display for everybody to enjoy free of charge. Visitors should not forget to eat 12 raisins, one for each month of the year, as the clock strikes midnight... a Portuguese tradition!

Lisbon Carnival

February 2016 (exact dates tbc)

If you are in Lisbon for the Carnival season, you will find the streets crowded with excited partygoers. Celebrated every year with a number of street parties and free events across the city, the highlight is the Carnival Parade, which takes place on Shrove Tuesday, which in 2016 falls on 9th February. Expect dazzling costumes, bright masks and of course lots of confetti.

Monstra (Lisbon Animated Film Festival)

3rd – 13th March 2016

Monstra is a festival to promote the world's best animated films, including documentaries, cartoons, short films and the latest 3D and computer productions. Aimed at both adults and



young people with its "Monstrinha" version, the 2016 edition of Monstra will screen up to 500 films in its ten-day programme, which will also include workshops and master classes.

Lisbon Half Marathon EDP 20th March 2016

The race traverses some of Lisbon's most famous landmarks but its pinnacle is crossing the 25th April Bridge free of vehicles – which was the main idea behind the very first half marathon back in 1990.
