Known for its seafront promenade, over the years **Estoril** has grown as an upmarket holiday destination, with fine restaurants, world class golf courses and a range of golden sand beaches. Once the second home of the Spanish, Italian, French, Bulgarian and Romanian royal families, Estoril is known for its 007 connections: the elegant resort is home to Europe's largest casino, reputed to have been Ian Fleming's inspiration for the first James Bond novel 'Casino Royale', while Palácio Hotel served as the set for the James Bond film 'On Her Majesty's Secret Service'!

CASCAIS: A FIRM FAVOURITE WITH EUROPEAN ROYALS

A former fishing village, **Cascais** has transformed itself into a chic seaside resort, brimming with good food, cultural events and shopping opportunities, all set against the background of a picturesque historic centre. A European royalty favourite for centuries, there are various fine beaches to choose from, as well as a dedicated marina, home to elegant yachts. Cascais can easily be explored on two wheels (bicycles are available to rent for free), while for a sample of its fishing heritage you can visit the popular fish market, which is open every weekday.

WHAT'S HAPPENING – FIVE REASONS TO VISIT THE LISBON COAST IN 2016

 Tee off at Europe's best golf destination: The Lisbon Golf Coast – featuring more than 20 golf courses around the Portuguese capital – was named Europe's 'Best Golf Destination' by the International Association of Golf Tour Operators at the end of last year, the third time Lisbon receives this distinction. The region attracts tens of



thousands of British golfers every year thanks to its wide choice of courses, affordable green fees, reasonably priced quality hotel and resort accommodation – and the International Golf Week, taking place in Cascais from 29th October – 5th November 2016, promises an amazing golf experience for all participants.

- 2. Celebrate the seventh art 10 years of the Lisbon & Estoril Film Festival: Marking its 10th edition in 2016, the Lisbon & Estoril Film Festival (4th-13th November) aims to bring together filmmakers, artists, writers, philosophers, musicians, actors, choreographers, composers and photographers from all over the world, guests at last year's event included acclaimed directors Wim Wenders and Jonathan Demme. Alongside film screenings (competition, retrospectives and tributes), the festival also features conferences, master classes and exhibitions, as well as an international symposium.
- 3. Spend the night like a king: Whether by the sea, in a palace or close to the town centre, both Cascais and Estoril offer a great variety of luxury accommodation. In Cascais, options include the Farol Hotel, built on the edge of the cliffs, as well as the former palace of Italy's last King, Humberto II, at Grande Real Villa Itália Hotel & Spa, near the rock formations of Boca do Inferno. Estoril is home, among other properties, to Palácio Estoril Hotel Golf & Spa, opened in 1930 and considered one of Europe's greatest hotels. For a culinary delight, head to Hotel Fortaleza do Guincho, whose restaurant, managed by Chef Miguel Rocha Vieira, features one Michelin star.
- 4. Join the locals to celebrate the ties of Cascais with the sea: Held every August, the 10day Festival of the Sea (Festas do Mar) celebrates the special relationship Cascais has developed with the sea over the centuries. The annual festivities include a series of live music and folk dances that concentrate on Praia do Pescador (Fisherman's Beach), close to Hotel Baia. There is also a Mass, followed by a procession, while the last day of the Festival is marked with a fireworks display and a parade of boats at the Bay of Cascais.
- 5. Find the perfect souvenir at the oldest handicraft fair in Portugal: Taking place every summer from late June to early September, the Estoril Handicraft Fair (the oldest of its kind in Portugal) brings together more than one hundred artisans from all over Portugal, demonstrating century-old techniques and tools. Located behind the Estoril Casino and open daily until midnight, you will find stalls with handmade crafts from Portugal's regions and abroad, as well as a number of open-air restaurants and entertainment performances, such as folk dance demonstrations and fado singing.

Direct flights to Lisbon operate from London, Manchester, Liverpool, Edinburgh, Birmingham and Bristol with TAP Portugal, BA, Monarch, easyJet and Ryanair.
